COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course introduces the art of Europe from 1400 till the middle of the 19th century and will provide students with a basic knowledge of some current art historical techniques to understand and appreciate the forms of art and to build their own possible approaches in the appreciation of art. The course ends with 1863, the year when Manet paints *Olympia*, the end of the Classical Age and the beginning of Modernism.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- o Familiarize students with the major centers and creators of the period
- o Give an outline of the historical events that had an impact on artistic output
- Look into the sociological background of art
- Understand how different cultures can be assessed with anthropological methods

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- o Students will gain an understanding of the different definitions of art
- o Students will develop a sense of visual memory and skills
- Students will be able to assess the different societal and historical factors in art production
- Students will improve writing, referencing, research, and argumentative skills on art historical and art-related topics.
