## **Course Description**

The aim of this course is to help students become more comfortable in their English usage that they can more authentically express themselves, describe their ideas, techniques and final projects to contemporaries.

## **Course Objectives and Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of this course, students will:

- 1. Demonstrate an understanding of the nature of the relationship between creative thinking and communication
- 2. Be able to explain theoretical approaches to creative communication as well as the creative process.
- 3. Employ your oral skills in public speaking problem solving, decision-making and a variety of communication contexts
- 4. Demonstrate the fundamentals of Public Speaking

#### **Course Format**

Two classes each week: Monday and Wednesday 1600-1730

#### Class Organization

Students will give public presentation on various topics to be determined by Instructor. Presentations will be both individual and as a group. Each presentation will require a written manuscript to be reviewed prior to the presentation. Each presentation will be followed by class discussion.

## **Grading Guidelines**

- **D, F** Fails to demonstrate comprehension of course concepts, is poorly executed or not attempted or completed. Repeated unexplained absents.
