Course Description

This course is designed to provide an introduction to abnormal Psychology and psychopathology. The course will cover material on various psychological disorders, theories about their development; how disorders are diagnosed and assessed; their clinical course; and how they are treated. Current theory and research will be emphasized.

Course objectives:

By the end of the course, students will be able to:

- Understand the nature of abnormal behavior and mental illness.
- Understand the process of assessing such behavior and the most commonly used system for classifying psychological disorders.
- Be familiar with and able to discuss several different theoretical perspectives on psychological disorders.
- Be familiar with the research methods used and research findings on various psychological disorders.
- Understand the causes and be able to identify the symptoms of various psychological disorders.
- Be familiar with effective treatment approaches to different psychological disorders.
- Understand various legal issues relevant to mental illness and abnormal behavior.

Teaching methods

The course will integrate a number of reading materials, lectures, discussions and video presentations.

Course Requirements and Assignments

Attendance: Because active discussion and participation are integral parts of the learning experience in this course, class attendance is expected.

Reading: Students are expected to read course materials every week, while paying attention to their thoughts, reactions and feelings. Emailing me with notes or questions about the week's material or about the lessons is encouraged. These comments will be discussed in class, and will be assessed as part of the grading for participation.

Assignments

Case Presentation: Students will be requested to present in couples one 'Case Study' from the 'Case studies book'.

Final paper: Students will be required to write a final paper. Papers must be typed neatly, double spaced and stapled. All submitted papers should include the student's name, project title and class information. All assignments will be collected during class on the due date. No late papers will be accepted. The paper is due on the last meeting. The students will be expected to describe in detail and offer a diagnosis for a character from a book/film, and then make suggestions for possible therapeutic measures.

Papers should be about 3-4 pages long, and students are expected to incorporate the knowledge gained in the course. Details about grading will be discussed in class.

Final Exam:

Students will be presented with a number of cases and will be asked to analyze them. Students will be expected to describe symptoms, give diagnoses, and suggest Psychological theories and therapeutic approaches that might be relevant to the cases.
