

WHO WE ARE

McDaniel College is an accredited, private selective College of the Liberal Arts and Sciences, located in Westminster, Maryland, U.S.A., where students from 21 countries prepare for lives of leadership and service. The European Campus of McDaniel College in Budapest is accredited by the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools. McDaniel College Budapest is registered in Hungary as a foreign institution of higher education by the permission of the Hungarian Minister of Education. It offers a **standard American four-year undergraduate program in Hungary**, leading to a Bachelor of Arts degree.

A unique feature of the program is that students have the option to complete the upper two years of **study at the main campus of the college in the United States**. In addition, students enrolled at Budapest earn credits that are fully transferable to any other American college or university with the provision that they are based on grades of at least "C" or higher.

BUDAPEST CAMPUS


- Central location (VII district of Budapest).

FLEXIBLE PROGRAM

McDaniel College is flexible: you can enter our program as undecided, sample a number of different courses, and then choose your major based on what you prefer. In addition, if you decide you would like to pursue a major different than the one you started, you can change majors—all of the credits you have earned remain on your record, and no time is lost for graduation.

DUAL MAJOR

Some of our majors can be pursued in combined dual major programs—art-communication, business-economics—that combine the best features of more than one major program in order to give students more options after graduation.

DESCRIPTION

The major in Political Science and International Studies is designed to provide an understanding of political systems in general and of the American government, European affairs, and international relations in particular.

This major provides intellectual and practical preparation for public service, diplomacy, and journalism, and serves as a preparation for law studies and other graduate-level pursuits. Small classes permit students to hone their information literacy, research methods, and communication skills. McDaniel's Budapest campus exposes students to a host of different cultures and in ternational institutions, while its campus in Maryland provides a platform for work in Washington, D.C.

SOME OF OUR COURSES

ON INTERNATIONAL LAW AND ORGANISATION

/An introduction to the history, purpose, environmental policy and scope of international law and organizations. Questions this course attempts to answer include: How does international law affect states, international organizations, non-state actors, and individuals? Who creates international law, and who is governed by it? What is the relation between international and domestic law? What role do international organizations play in the international system? How does membership in international organizations influence states' abilities to achieve their goals?/

APPROACHES TO INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

/An introduction to the major theories and approaches for analyzing global developments, studying the structure and organization of the international system, examining the various actors shaping world politics, exploring causes of conflicts and means for conflict resolution, and reflecting on the future of international relations and the role of individuals in the world community./

US FOREIGN POLICY

/An overview over U.S. foreign policy from the Second World War to present. The primary objective is to acquire a general understanding of the main ideas, events, and strategies that have shaped U.S. foreign policy over the past half-century. Topics discussed include containment, deterrence, the nuclear arms race, humanitarian intervention and the use of force, economic assistance and trade, and a number of regional and thematic issues./
