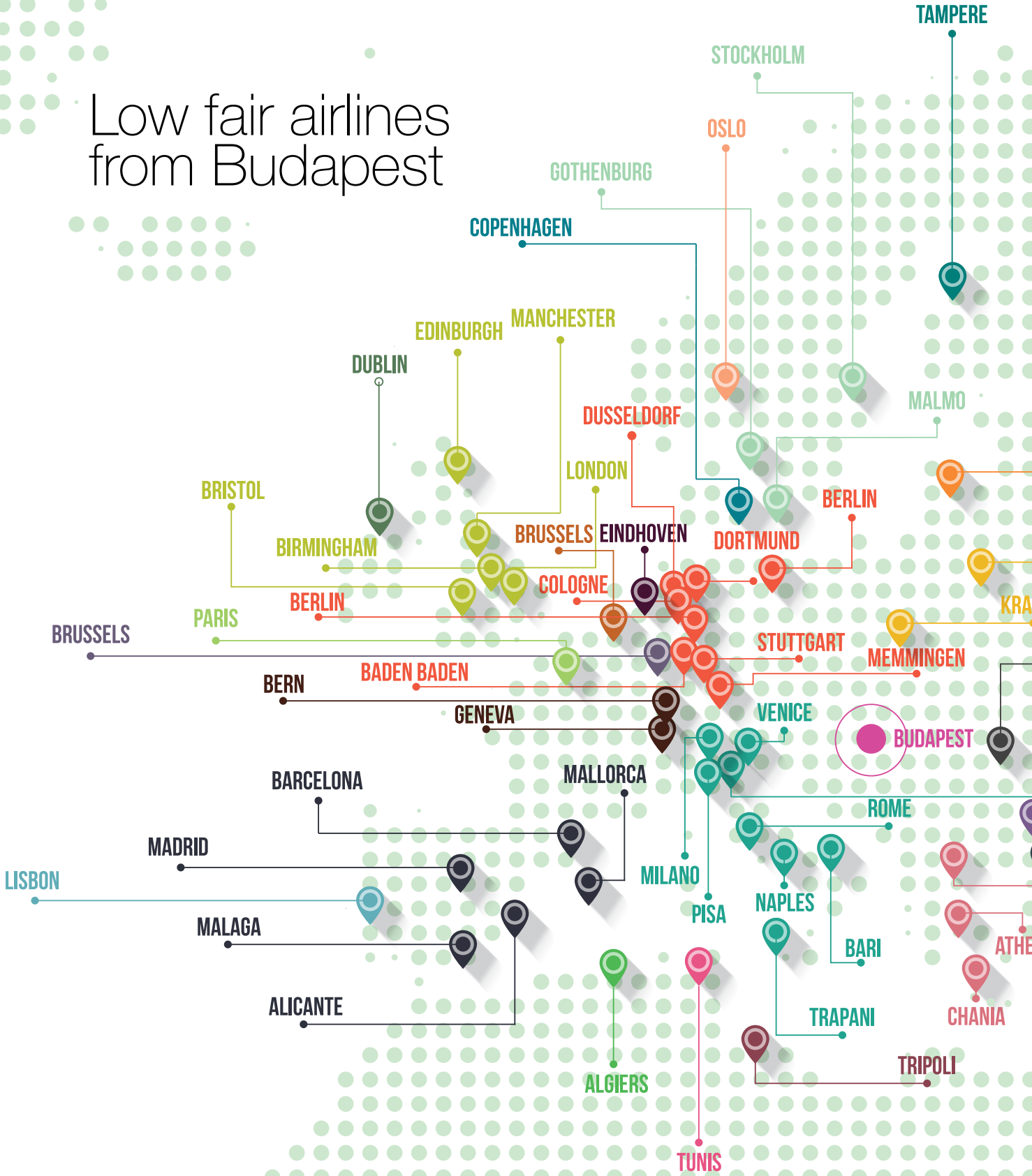

LOCATION

BUDAPEST, HUNGARY

Buzzing Budapest, often dubbed the “Paris of the East” for its awe-inspiring architecture and atmosphere, is Hungary’s capital and home to around two million people, which is around a fifth of Hungary’s population. It’s the country’s pulsating heart that never takes a break from its vibrant cultural, political and economic life. The river Danube dramatically separates leafy and hilly Buda from the dynamic plain of Pest. The city’s historical and cultural legacy is alive and well, with around five million visitors pouring in yearly to revel in the city’s plethora attractions that include awesome Habsburg-era architecture, thermal baths that date back to the Turkish-occupation, beautiful bridges and the scintillating Sziget Festival.

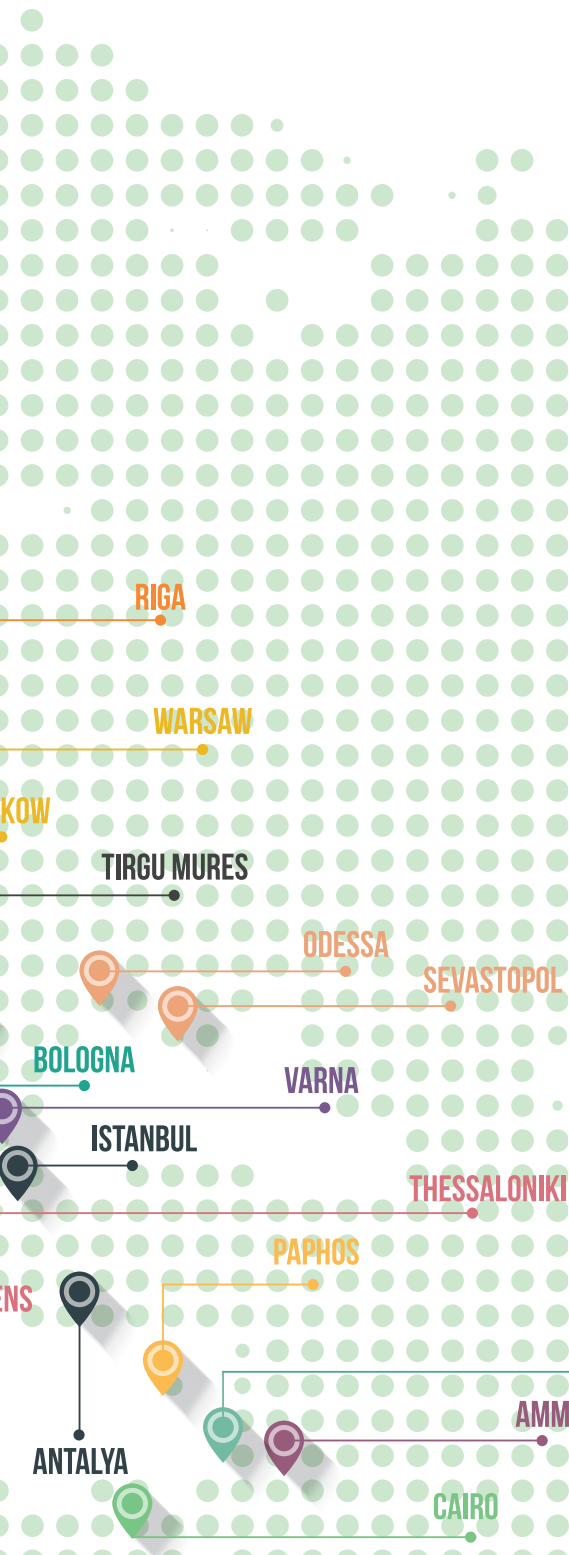
Hungary, with a population of 10 million, lies in the very heart of Europe. Since May 1 2004, it has been a member of the European Union. Other major European cities are within easy reach of Budapest. Students coming from countries under visa obligation can enjoy the benefits of a residence permit which entitles them to visit other countries of the European Union without having to apply for visas. The climate in Hungary is temperate, and sunshine is a dominant feature, except for some rain and snow from November through January.

WESTMINSTER, MARYLAND, U.S.A.

The 160-acre campus of the main campus overlooks Westminster, a charming and historic town in central Maryland. The campus has a strategic location: a short distance from two of the nation’s metropolitan centers. Baltimore, just 30 miles away, is the home of major banking, shipping and communication industries. Washington, D.C., the nation’s capital, is a short hour’s drive from the campus. Both cities offer McDaniel students exceptional opportunities for learning, internship and leisure.

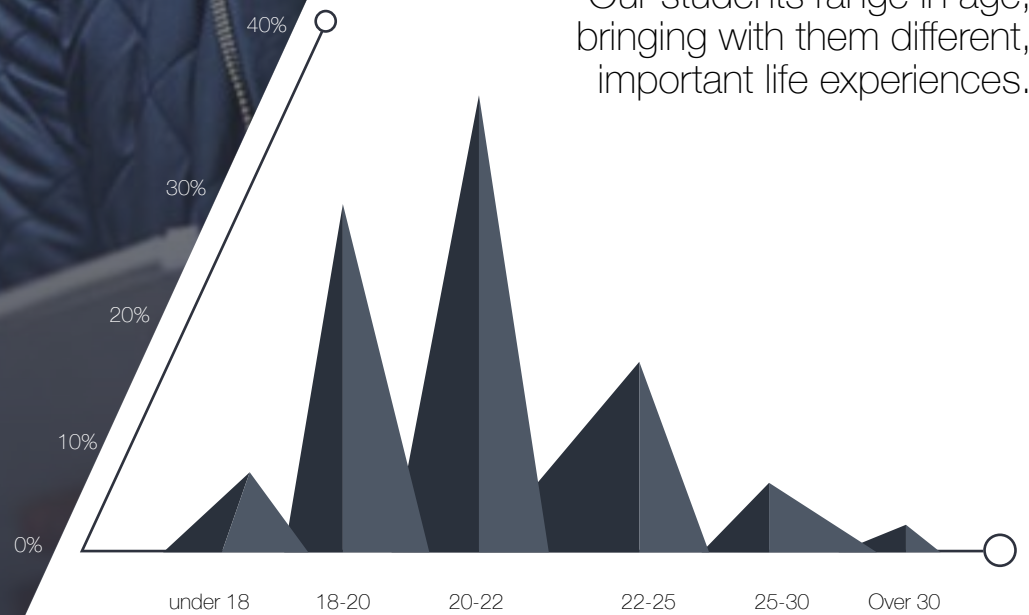
Campus facilities include the 170,000 volume Hoover Library, several computer labs, and a new Science Building, equipped with an electron microscope. McDaniel College considers participation in sports and fitness activities an integral part of the educational program. The campus has outstanding athletic facilities: several gyms, a fitness center, a swimming pool, volleyball, basketball, squash and tennis courts, soccer and football fields, and a golf course.

Most students transferring to the main campus reside on campus, although it is also possible to make individual arrangements for living off-campus. The college offers two kinds of housing: traditional residence halls and apartment-type arrangements.

STUDENT LIFE

THIRTY-FIVE NATIONS

The student body of McDaniel College Budapest forms a truly international community. Students come from over 35 different countries. Since everyone speaks English, it is easy to make friends, and learning about fellow students' cultures and customs on a personal level becomes an education in itself. Each semester, a group of students from the home campus of the college in Maryland come to Budapest for a study abroad semester, which contributes to the special blend of the student body. The academic program in Budapest is enriched by courses taught by visiting professors from the main campus.

Most graduates of the Budapest Campus look back on the years spent here as a memorable and defining experience which changed their lives. What graduates value most highly – apart from the quality of the academic program – is the friendly, caring and stimulating atmosphere of the college. Although it is not mandatory for graduation to spend some time at the home campus in Maryland, many students of the Budapest campus feel that their education would not be complete without the unique experience of becoming part of a predominantly American student community and making the best use of the excellent academic and internship opportunities in Maryland.

THE AMERICAN SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION

Known for its flexibility, the American system of higher education has several distinctive features. First, it provides a broader and more varied

education than many other systems by giving its students three kinds of courses: general courses to fulfill competence requirements, required courses within their chosen fields of study, and electives, which students can choose from any discipline that interests them.

Another characteristic of the American system is that it continuously assesses students from the beginning, thus providing regular feedback to the students about their academic progress. This progress is measured in credit hours, of which a student must earn 128 at McDaniel to graduate with a Bachelor's degree, the standard first degree in American higher education. One credit equals 15 hours of classroom instruction in a semester comprising 15 weeks, in other words, a four-credit course will involve at least 60 hours of classroom instruction in one semester. Students satisfying all requirements for a course and achieving a passing grade will earn four credits for the course, unless otherwise indicated. Students are required to maintain satisfactory academic standing throughout their studies.

The formal requirement for entry into an American college is successful completion of secondary or high school education, which means about 12 years of schooling altogether. Traditionally, a Bachelor's degree can be attained in four years of study. In the American system, the first degree is a prerequisite for admission into any graduate (Master's) program, or professional school (law, medicine, etc.)

AMERICAN DIPLOMA

Four years of study at McDaniel College Budapest confers, upon its successful completion, an American Bachelor's Degree. This degree, coupled with the rich experience that comes with study at an American institution of higher education in a dynamic multicultural environment, opens the door to work and further study not only in the United States, but in any institution worldwide in which initiative, openness, ambition and creativity are sought. The McDaniel diploma is recognized in America and throughout the world. Alumni of the McDaniel Budapest campus can be found working in businesses, governments, and not-for-profit organizations in countless countries. They not only enhance institutions; they found them. An American diploma from McDaniel College signifies a spirit of learning, global engagement, adaptability, personal development, and service to others.

THE AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

All students are encouraged to complete at least one semester at the home campus of the college in the United States during their studies. It is also possible to transfer to the main campus for the upper two years of study, leading to the degree.

Students from the Budapest Campus are entitled to a 54 percent discount from the standard tuition fee on the main campus in Maryland. This is a special privilege that is available only for the students who transfer to the main campus from McDaniel College Budapest.

The main campus offers a wide variety of academic programs, with over 33 majors and 47 minors. In addition to the major fields of study available in Budapest, McDaniel College Budapest students transferring to the main campus have the option to graduate with other majors as well.

International students who complete the senior year (4th year) leading to the degree at the home campus of the college in Maryland are entitled to the benefits of the federal program of Optional Practical Training (OPT). It enables international students to prolong their stays in the U.S. after graduation and take jobs without needing to apply for work visas.

ART MAJORS

Major description

The Studio Art/Art History major provides students with the opportunity to develop their artistic and creative abilities while gaining a global perspective on the arts. A critical approach to art in its social, historical, and cultural context complements students' own creative work and process. Students learn to describe, analyze, and interpret the form and content of works of art, while examining the significant movements of Western art as well as the secular and sacred art of Asia, Africa, and the Americas. At the same time, students acquire an array of techniques for their own artistic self-expression, ranging from two- and three-dimensional design, to computer graphics and web design, photography, painting, and sculpture. Classes are small and involve close work with our professors, and students benefit from a wealth of opportunities to view historic and contemporary art in Budapest, a major European art center.

Job and further study opportunities

Students completing the Studio Art and Art History major are equipped to continue their studies in well-known Masters of Fine Arts Programs, as well as Ph.D. programs in art history. They have entered the workplace as graphic and web designers, photographers and event organizers, able to bridge different visual cultures in the service of businesses, museums, schools, and marketing firms.

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION & ECONOMICS

Major description

The Business Administration and Economics major provides quantitative, analytical, and creative skills necessary for careers in international business, accounting, law, as well as service in national and international agencies. The Business/Economics major fosters an understanding and appreciation of economic forms of explanation, training students in economic theory and policy. At the same time, it prepares students to serve as principled, globally-minded business professionals, able to bridge management cultures and operate as key players in international networks. Small classes permit the one-on-one development of key statistical techniques, communication skills, and creative entrepreneurship necessary today around the world. Regular internships provide opportunities to integrate practice and theory.

Job and further study opportunities

Students completing the Business/Economics major are ready to continue their studies in Masters of Business or Economics Ph.D. programs. With their strong statistical background, as well as their expertise in management, students find opportunities in business, finance, marketing firms, and state, international, and not-for-profit institutions demanding sophisticated data analysis and forecasts.

COMMUNICATION

Major description

An interdisciplinary major, Communication deals with the function, processes, and analysis of human communication from one-on-one interactions to global networks. Communication students are engaged in both analyzing and creating verbal, non-verbal, visual, and social messages and meanings. They learn to design messages for specific audiences, interpret mediated messages of all kinds, and act as mediators between different organizations and cultures. Small class sizes permit one-on-one work where Communication students learn how to create an effective social science study, and employ it in an individually-tailored research project. Communication internship and independent study opportunities give students the chance to apply their skills in journalistic forums and social media.

Job and further study opportunities

Students completing the Communication major are prepared for graduate work in communication theory, media studies, film and cinematography, journalism, and information systems, and for professional careers in video, print and electronic media, advertising, etc. The program offers opportunities for internships in various aspects of the field including newspaper publishing, and public relations writing in Budapest.

POLITICAL SCIENCE AND INTERNATIONAL STUDIES

Major description

The major in Political Science and International Studies is designed to provide an understanding of political systems in general and of the American government, European affairs, and international relations in particular. It provides intellectual and practical preparation for public service, diplomacy, and journalism, and serves as a preparation for law studies and other graduate-level pursuits. Small classes permit students to hone their information literacy, research methods, and communication skills. McDaniel's Budapest campus exposes students to a host of different cultures and international institutions, while its campus in Maryland provides a platform for work in Washington, D.C.

Job and further study opportunities

Students completing the Political Science and International Studies major pursue careers in government and politics, intelligence, international business, international non-profit organizations, law, research and analysis, and media. They advance to postgraduate work in fields like electoral studies, media and politics, public policy, international security, international law, peace studies, political philosophy, governmental institutions, and studies of major geographic regions (Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America, and the Middle East).

PSYCHOLOGY

Major description

The Psychology major involves coursework that explores behavior, emotions, cognitive processes and the factors that influence them from a variety of perspectives. Psychology is a pluralistic discipline with roots in and connections to the natural sciences, the social sciences, medicine, and the humanities. The McDaniel Europe program gives students training in these various roots, providing rigorous theoretical and practical training necessary for a career as a psychologist in medicine, business, and education, as well as preparation for graduate-level work. Psychology students work closely with faculty and other students on research projects, developing their own, individualized research projects in their final year. This work is enhanced with internship opportunities putting students in different, challenging organizational environments in which their growing knowledge of psychology is essential.

Job and further study opportunities

Students completing the Psychology major will find many professional opportunities in business, education, medicine, and public administration. The Psychology major is also the best platform for advancing to graduate programs in counseling, school psychology, education, clinical psychology, psychological science, social work, criminal justice, organizational psychology, behavior analysis, law school and education administration.

Minor description

Our Journalism Minor offers a range of highly practical courses incorporating key theoretical and ethical elements, enabling students to pursue a career in journalism, including within the field of their majors.

Learn how to structure everything from hard news stories, thought-provoking opinion pieces and features to mastering the art of creating catchy 140-character strategies to turn Twitter into an effective social entrepreneurship tool. These skills are transferrable to all manner of fields beyond journalism, whereby the reporting and writing skills acquired serve to improve one's abilities of analysis and expression, providing a path to thought leadership, particularly in the fields of business and communication.

Job and further study opportunities

While we live in the digital era and the Z generation has indeed grown up as part of the global village, the critical skills necessary to make your way in the world of writing and reporting remain constant. It's still very much about asking tough questions, carefully examining your stories and then presenting tight and compelling reports of what you uncover. What has changed considerably are some of the practical skills, platforms and forums. Our minor strikes a balance between understanding how internet-based and multi-media reporting works in order to ensure optimal engagement with the readership, while maintaining the traditional skills expected of an accomplished reporter. In addition, students become acquainted with the ethical standards expected, both in print and online, and understand the background of these standards.

CURRICULUM

All courses listed on the curriculum represent four credits, unless otherwise indicated. The standard workload is to take four regular courses in one semester and earn 16 credits, but students should undertake programs they can handle successfully. Twelve credit hours (three regular courses) is the minimum a student should carry in order to be considered “full-time”. No student will be allowed to carry six regular courses in one semester.

ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

GRADING SYSTEM

The scholastic standing of students is indicated by a system of grades designated by the letters A, B, C, D, F and I (Incomplete). Plus and minus grades (e.g. an A- or a B+) may be assigned and will influence a student’s grade point average. A, B, C and D are passing grades, “A” indicating the work of the highest rank, “D” of the lowest. Students receiving a grade of “F” (Failure) must repeat the course if they wish to receive credit for it. A student who withdraws from a course before the deadline specified for withdrawals on the Calendar receives a grade of “W” and the course will not be counted in figuring the student’s grade point average.

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS

To maintain class standing, students are expected to complete the normal academic program with at least a 2.0 or “C” average.

CLASS ATTENDANCE

In all courses regular and prompt attendance is required. Irregular attendance or prolonged absence without any justifiable cause will result in the denial of credit for the given course. Absence from class does not excuse the student from class assignments, recitations, readings, term reports, examinations, and any other academic work designated by the instructor.

REPEAT POLICY

A student has the option to repeat and pass a course previously failed in order to gain credits toward graduation. There is no limit to the number of repeats a student may take.

ADMISSION AND APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

McDaniel College Budapest welcomes all applications for admission by students with appropriate academic qualifications, a good command of English, and a strong motivation to study.

McDaniel College Budapest follows a system of rolling admissions, in other words, students may enter the four-year degree program in both semesters as the curriculum enables them to take all first-semester courses in the spring as well.

Application for admission is free of charge.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

To apply to McDaniel College Budapest, complete the attached application form or do it online at mcdaniel.hu/apply and enclose the following:

- 1 A personal essay (300 words minimum). This personal essay helps us become acquainted with you as a person and student. Write about your family background, your upbringing, your motivations for seeking admission into an American degree program and choosing the major field of study you have indicated, your longer-term career goals, any topic or view that you find important to share with us.
- 2 Photocopy or official transcript of graduation from Senior High School, Certificate of Final Examination, Diploma of Graduation, and other documents demonstrating that you have completed secondary education and qualify for entry into an institution of higher education; test scores of American college-bound exams (SAT, ACT) if you graduated from high school in the United States, and certified and authentic English translations of all documents originally issued in languages other than English.
- 3 A Letter of Recommendation in English from the Principal or instructors of the secondary school you graduated from or from employers you worked for;
- 4 One passport-size photos;
- 5 A medical certificate in English verifying that you do not suffer from any chronic diseases, and are physically and mentally capable of undertaking studies at an institution of higher education;
- 6 Curriculum Vitae in English (attach a separate page);
- 7 Photocopy of passport with personal data.

APPLY NOW

Online application: mcdaniel.hu/apply

We review the applications in order to determine that the applicants meet all formal requirements for admission. If necessary entrance examinations will be arranged either in Budapest for applicants from Europe or in the home countries of the applicants in the case of applications from Africa, Asia and the Middle East.

For applicants wishing to enter the Program in the Fall Semester, the examinations are usually held in the third week of June. Another entrance exam will be offered in Budapest for late applicants from Europe in the third week of August. For applicants wishing to enter the Program in the Spring Semester, an entrance examination will be administered in the third week of January.

If the entrance exam takes place outside Budapest, in the home country of the applicant, an additional examination fee will be charged.

Applicants DON'T HAVE TO TAKE AN ENTRANCE EXAM, if he or she:

- obtained an International Baccalaureate Diploma
- took an American college-bound exam (SAT Scholastic Aptitude Test) with a total score of at least 1500 on the three sections
- obtained a British General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) in at least six subjects with grades of "C" or better
- have a valid TOEFL Score Record of at least 65 on the iBT exam (or 5.5 on the IELTS) and appropriate academic qualifications will be exempted from the entrance examination.

Acceptance

Applicants who take the entrance examination in Budapest will be notified of the result at the end of the oral interview on the second day of the exams. Students who take the entrance examination abroad will be notified of the results within three weeks. Those who applied for admission from countries outside Europe are required to transfer the tuition fee for the first academic year in full or in part before applying for the Hungarian student visa (see chapter on Cost of the Four-year Program for details).

TRANSFER CREDITS

Students wishing to transfer credits for courses taken at other accredited American colleges should enclose transcripts to their application, together with a short description of the courses completed. In addition, an official transcript should be sent from their institution directly to the Registrar's Office of McDaniel College (2 College Hill, Westminster, MD 21157-4390, U.S.A.). Credits will be granted for major courses and standard liberal arts courses comparable to the offerings of McDaniel College, provided that they are based on grades of "C" or better.

The college recognizes International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma and grants credits to new students for higher-level exams with test scores of 5 or higher.

entry permit



ENTRY PERMIT FOR HUNGARY

International students from countries under visa obligation are required to apply for a visa at the Hungarian Embassy or Consulate in their home countries. The entry permit will be granted on presenting the Letter of Acceptance from the receiving institution and proof of payment for tuition (instructions for payment will be enclosed to your Letter of Acceptance). Students will have to register with the Immigration Office in Budapest within 30 days upon arrival. International students from "visa free" countries (e.g. Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Croatia, Israel, U.S.) may enter Hungary without having to apply for an entry permit, but they will also be required to apply for a residence permit on arrival. Citizens of countries of the European Union and the European Economic Area will be required to register their addresses at the Immigration Office at the end of the first 90-day period of their stay.

Those applying for a residence permit will be required to declare that they do not suffer from AIDS, venereal disease, pulmonary tuberculosis or leprosy, nor are they carriers of typhus or paratyphus bacteria.

HOUSING

The Budapest Campus of McDaniel College has no dormitory facilities, but housing arrangements can be made, upon request, through the Housing Service Office (www.budapesthousing.com, apalfi@mcdaniel.hu). Most international students decide to rent small apartments or stay with families as paying guests.

MEDICAL CARE AND HEALTH INSURANCE

A full basic health insurance valid for Hungary is a prerequisite for registration.

This insurance also can be obtained in Hungary for approximately 300 USD/year. See details in the acceptance letter.

(1) Students from the Budapest Campus may choose to live off-campus in Westminster, but they are expected to make individual arrangements for finding an apartment. Transfer students are advised to reside on campus. The amounts given are based on the rate of a standard double room in a traditional residence hall. The rates for apartment-type housing, equipped with kitchen facilities (double occupancy), are somewhat higher.

(2) The college offers "block plans" of 150 to 240 meals (an average of 10/16 meals per week) in order to provide maximum flexibility. Board is optional for students living in apartment-type housing or off-campus.

(3) The matriculation fee is a one-time initial enrollment fee.

(4) The unused balance of the security deposit will be returned when student leaves campus housing.

REMARK: Modest annual increase in tuition, room and board may be expected.

MERIT-BASED TUITION DISCOUNT PROGRAM

New students applying for admission into the degree programs at the Budapest Campus are entitled to merit-based tuition discounts on the basis of their academic qualifications and scores on language proficiency exams (for details visit www.mcdaniel.hu).

Degree students of the Budapest Campus in good academic standing are entitled to academic achievement awards after the first year ranging from annual discounts of EUR 500 to EUR 2,000 depending on their grade point averages.

McDaniel College has established a scholarship program for McDaniel College Budapest students to facilitate their transfer to Westminster for the upper two years and to enable them to complete their studies at the home campus in the United States at a reasonable cost.

The financial aid awards (reflected in the special tuition rate for McDaniel College Budapest students) will be made on a one-year basis, and will be renewable if the student has maintained the required academic standing. The minimum requirement for any tuition discount granted to students transferring to Westminster is an overall Grade Point Average of at least 2.00.

REFUND POLICY

Students are not entitled to a refund of the tuition fee if they are compelled to withdraw for academic or disciplinary reasons.

Students are entitled to a refund on a pro-rata basis if studies are interrupted due to prolonged illness, or other unexpected circumstances such as the death of a parent or guardian, the obligation to do military service, etc.

The refund is applicable from the first day of the month following notification of the above-described circumstances with accompanying official certification.
